## Kitten Wellness Care Checklist

Kittens should be vaccinated every 3-4 weeks, starting at 6-8 weeks of age. While every kitten will have a tailored plan that you are comfortable with, a typical vaccination plan will look like this:

### Visit One:

- Physical examination by Veterinarian
- Feline Leukemia/Feline Immunodeficiency Virus Test (FELV + FIV Combo Test)
- Intestinal Parasite Screening
- Oral Deworming
- Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis/Calicivirus/Panleukopenia (FVRC-P)
  Vaccination
- o Discuss the benefits of HomeAgain Microchip
- Discuss the benefits of Pet Health Insurance
- First Dose of Revolution FREE (Prevent Fleas, Heartworm, Parasites, Ear Mites)

### • Visit Two:

- Examination by Registered Veterinary Technician
- Discuss Dental Care
- FVRC-P Vaccination
- Feline Leukemia Vaccination
- Oral Deworming Treatment
- o Refill Revolution (Prevent Fleas, Heartworms, Parasites, Ear Mites)

### Visit Three:

- Examination by Registered Veterinary Technician
- FVRC-P Vaccination
- Feline Leukemia Vaccination
- Oral Deworming Treatment
- Refill Revolution (Prevent Fleas, Heartworms, Parasites, Ear Mites)

### • Visit Four:

Examination by Registered Veterinary Technician

- Rabies Vaccination
- Recommend schedule Spay/Neuter at six months of age
- Refill Revolution (Prevent Fleas, Heartworms, Parasites, Ear Mites)

Regular grooming is important to maintain your pet's overall health.

This checklist includes all recommended Feline Core Vaccines, an Intestinal Parasite Screening Test for parasites, the recommended preventative physical examinations and First Dose of Revolution (Flea, Heartworm, Parasite) medication. Each visit will provide you with the opportunity to discuss your kitten's health care development, nutrition and any other concerns you have.

This checklist does not include additional parasite treatment for positive Intestinal Screening Tests. This checklist also does not include additional physical exams, noncore vaccinations, treatments or medications needed by your kitten due to illness or injury. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to ask.
